**TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER**

**THE LONDON BOROUGH OF BARKING AND DAGENHAM  
(BANNED TURNS AND PROHIBITIONS) (VARIOUS ROADS)  
ORDER 2022**

The Council of the London Borough of Barking and Dagenham in exercise of their powers under Sections 6, 124 and Parts I to IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter called "the Act") as amended by the relevant provisions of the Local Government Act 1985 the Parking Act 1989 and all other enabling and amending legislation and enabling powers, and after consultation with the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis in accordance with Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Act, hereby make the following Order:

1. This Order shall come into operation on 17 June 2022 and may be cited as The London Borough of Barking and Dagenham (Banned Turns and Prohibitions) (Various Roads) Order 2022.
2. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply to this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. For the purposes of this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:
  - a. "enactment" means any enactment whether public, general or local and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment and any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment;
  - b. "council" means the Council of the London Borough of Barking and Dagenham;
  - c. "bus", "local bus", "pedal cycle" and "taxi" has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016;
  - d. "motor vehicle" has the same meaning as that in Section 136 of the Act;
  - e. "prescribed hours" means the periods specified in column 2 of Schedule 1 to this Order in relation to the streets or sections of streets specified in column 1 of that Schedule;
  - f. "provision of a universal postal service" and "universal service provider" have the same meanings as in Part 3 of the Postal Services Act 2011;
  - g. "traffic sign" has the same meaning as in section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984; and
4. Save as provided in Article 8 of this Order, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle except Buses, Taxis and Pedal Cycles proceeding along Salisbury Avenue to make a left turn into Station Parade.

5. Save as provided in Article 8 of this Order, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle except Buses, Taxis and Pedal Cycles proceeding along Wakering Road to make a right turn into Station Parade.
6. Save as provided in Articles 7 and 8, no person shall cause any motor vehicle except for Buses, Taxis and Pedal Cycles to enter the streets or sections of streets shown in Schedule 1 to this Order during the prescribed hours.
7. Nothing in Article 6 of this Order shall apply to:-
  - a. a security vehicle or a vehicle bearing a livery which is used by a universal service provider and which is stopped at the edge of the carriageway for as long as may be necessary for the purposes of the provision of a universal postal service;
  - b. a vehicle being used for the laying, erection, alteration or repairs of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication system provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the performance of such duties for that vehicle to enter any section of street specified in those articles;
  - c. any vehicle when used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for that vehicle to enter any section of street specified in those articles.
8. Nothing in this Order shall apply:-
  - a. To a vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigades or police purposes;
  - b. To anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; or
  - c. To any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs places pursuant to Sections 66 or 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984.
9. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order the London Borough of Barking and Dagenham Traffic Management Order (Weight Restriction 7.5 tonne, mgw) Station Parade, Barking Order 2006 is hereby revoked insofar as it relates to a weight restriction.

<b>Longbridge Road</b> South-east side, from the roundabout to its junction with Station Parade	At any time
