Joint Waste Development Plan Document Adoption Statement 7 March 2012

This Adoption Statement gives notice that the London Boroughs of Barking & Dagenham, Havering, Newham and Redbridge resolved to adopt the Joint Waste Development Plan Document (DPD) on:

London Borough of Barking & Dagenham: 22 February 2012
London Borough of Havering: 1 February 2012
London Borough of Newham: 27 February 2012
London Borough of Redbridge: 19 January 2012

The purpose of the Joint Waste DPD is to set a framework for waste management in the East London Waste Authority Boroughs between 2011 and 2021. The DPD was examined by an independent Inspector and the Inspector's report was published in November 2011. The adopted DPD incorporates the binding recommendations of the Inspector.

Any person aggrieved by the Joint Waste DPD may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that the document is not within the appropriate power or that a procedural requirement has not been complied with. The application must be made promptly and in any event not later than the end of the six weeks from the date of this notice, ie **18 April 2012**.

The DPD, the Inspector's Report, this Adoption Statement, the Sustainability Appraisal Report and the Sustainability Appraisal Adoption Statement prepared in accordance with the Environmental Assessment of Plans and Programmes Regulations 2004 (16) (3) and (4) are available for public inspection on the Council's website at www.lbbd.gov.uk.
