The London Borough of Barking & Dagenham ("the Council") in exercise of its powers conferred by section 33A (2) of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and all other enabling powers hereby makes the following order

- This Order may be cited as 'The London Borough of Barking & Dagenham Permit Scheme Order 2015' and shall come into force on 1st October 2015.
- 2. The London Borough of Barking & Dagenham Permit Scheme which came into effect on 28th November 2011 under the Traffic Management (London Borough of Barking & Dagenham) Permit Scheme Order 2011 is varied to comply with the Traffic Management Permit Scheme (England) Regulations 2007 as amended by the Traffic Management Permit Scheme (England) Regulations 2015.
- 3. This Order applies to all public roads within the Borough with the exception of GLA roads.
 - In this Order "GLA Roads" means highways designated as a GLA road under section 14A of the Highways Act 1980.
- 4. The London Borough of Barking & Dagenham Permit Scheme set out in the Schedule to this Order, and which is commonly known as the London Permit Scheme, complies with all aspects of the Traffic Management Permit Scheme (England) Regulations 2007 as amended by the Traffic Management Permit Scheme (England) Regulations 2015, and with all other primary and secondary legislation in relation to Traffic Management Permit Schemes, and does not exceed the powers provided under such legislation.

- The London Borough of Barking & Dagenham Permit Scheme set out in the Schedule to this Order comes into effect on 1st October 2015.
- 6. Part 8 of the Traffic Management Permit Scheme (England)
 Regulations 2007 shall apply to the specified streets within the
 London Borough of Barking & Dagenham Permit Scheme 2015.
