

# Road Traffic Acts

## **THE LONDON BOROUGH OF BARKING AND DAGENHAM (WOOD LANE, HIGH ROAD AND GREEN LANE, DAGENHAM) (BUS LANE AND PRESCRIBED TURN) ORDER 202\*** **THE LONDON BOROUGH OF BARKING AND DAGENHAM (WAITING RESTRICTIONS) (WOOD LANE, DAGENHAM) AMENDMENT No. \* ORDER 202\***

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Barking and Dagenham in exercise of its powers under sections 6, 124 and Parts I to IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended (hereinafter called "the Act") and all other enabling legislation and powers and after consultation with the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis in accordance with Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Act propose to make the above Orders, the effect of which will be to:

1. Introduce a Buses, cycles, motorcycles and taxis only lane in the southern lane of the westbound carriageway of Wood Lane, from a point 91 metres north-east of its junction with Gosfield Road to a point 153.4 metres south-west of its junction with Gosfield Road.
2. Introduce a Left Turn Only (Except buses) restriction in the northernmost lane of the eastbound carriageway of High Road into Whalebone Lane North.
3. Introduce No Waiting at any time restrictions on Wood Lane, south-east side, from a point 67 metres south-west of its junction with Gosfield Road to a point 153.4 metres south-west of its junction with Gosfield Road.

Barking and Dagenham hereby GIVES FURTHER NOTICE in exercise of the powers under section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to;

4. Modify the existing pedestrian crossings into Toucan crossings on Green Lane, both sides, at its junction with Wood Lane and Whalebone Lane South.
