Saturation Point: Addressing the Health Impacts of Hot Food Takeaways Supplementary Planning Document (SPD)

The Council formally adopted Saturation Point: Addressing the Health Impacts of Hot Food Takeaways SPD on 21 July 2010.

The Hot Food Takeaway SPD forms part of the Council's Local Development Framework. The purpose of the Supplementary Planning Document is to explain the Council's overall guidance on controlling the development of hot food takeaways (Use Class A5). It is part of a strategic approach to tackle the Borough's obesity problem and in particular childhood obesity. It advises on the appropriate location and concentration of such premises. It supports policies in the Local Development Framework Core Strategy and the Council's emerging Development Plan Documents.

Any person aggrieved by the decision to adopt the Saturation Point: Addressing the Health Impacts of Hot Food Takeaways SPD may apply to the High Court for permission to apply for a judicial review of the decision to adopt the SPD. Any such application must be made no later than three months after the date on which the SPD was adopted.
