- 2. From 1 September 2020 to 12 October 2020, a local government elector for the area of the London Borough of Barking & Dagenham, or his/her representative may ask the auditor questions about the accounts. - 3. From 1 September 2020 to 12 October 2020, a local government elector for the area of the London Borough of Barking & Dagenham, or his/her representative, may object to the London Borough of Barking & Dagenham's accounts asking that the auditor issue a report in the public interest or apply for a declaration that an item in the accounts is contrary to law (under section 27 of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014). Written notice of a proposed objection and the grounds on which it is made must be sent to the auditor at the address given above and copied to me at the address given below.
