- 1.1 There is a planned overspend on Schools' block with an underspend on HNB and Early Years. It is likely that the Early Years underspend will need to be repaid.
- 1.2 The DSG outturn for 2020-21 is £9,828. The adjusted DSG outturn, after the Early Years adjustment is £7,461m.
- 1.3 HTs questioned whether it may be prudent to use some of the surplus to help SEN children and those with complex needs, catch up.
- 1.4 MN informed Schools' Forum that schools are at crisis point now due to the sheer number of children with complex needs and that the number of children coming into primary schools with EHC plans in September is unmanageable.
- 1.5 PH informed SF colleagues that as a HNB action she is looking at the census of two schools (Valence and George Carey) in comparison to January 2020. These schools have an exceptionally high number of children with complex needs. PH is also looking at notional budgets and comparing the actual and projected spend of an all through school.
- 1.6 PH urged caution about using the reserves as we are aware of more children coming through the system. Need to be strategic with the spend.
- 1.7 JTS questioned whether the Early Years underspend will be passported to providers if the DfE does not claw back the money. KH will provide an update after the DfE intention is known.
- 1.8 KA urged caution due to this being an unusual year and suggested that Schools' Forum use allocated budgets for this financial year rather than touching the reserves. If any additional pressures arise then we can look at using reserves to mitigate and deal with these pressures.
- 1.9 JH is supporting MN's point where individual schools with exceptional pressures need to be supported based on the evidence.
- 1.10 HT colleagues requested that Band G allocations for mainstream and special schools be made equal. Jacqui Twitchell is undertaking a banding audit which will be reported back to the HNB. This audit ties in with the placing of children in new ARPs.

1.12 A further HNB working party to take place in July to address the issues raised at today's meeting. Schools can feed issues to SH, RL and MN to be raised

- 4.2 There is a deferred need in top-ups.

5. HN Budget for 2021/22

- 5.1 There is a proposal for a Speech & Language post to work in partnership with health colleagues to provide additional support. This was initially for ARPS but there is an indication of need for early identification of need in primary schools. There is an available S&L therapist within health.
- 5.2 Even with the underspend, there are emerging pressures. There is a £500k overspend in Post 16, top-up panel, LACHES and special school funding all have an overspend also. There is always an overspend on special schools due to lagged funding.
- 5.3 Appendix 2 indicated the funding increases for pressure areas and provides comparisons on previous budgets. ARP funding and special school funding both increased. Some aspects of the top-up budget has increased and ARPS and Top up payments have been increased to 6%.
- 5.4 SH questioned whether the HNB is enough and whether needs can be met considering the numbers of HN children coming in is this borough. KA updated colleagues that the contingency set aside has been reduced to consider the additional pressures.
- 5.5 The Capital team are looking into ARP expansions. KH informed SF colleagues that Barking and Dagenham are very good as a borough at managing this budget.
- 5.6 JTS At the HNB Working Group an increase to Early Years ARP style provision, which could be attached to a mainstream school or a PVI, was discussed. PH will bring a report back in the Autumn term.

5.7 RL informed colleagues that the new special school, Oxlow bridge is in the planning stages and should open in September 2023, providing 100 places.

Colleagues were advised to direct all further issues to the HNB meeting in July.

- 7.3 DDI to meet with KA outside of Schools' Forum about how data is presented in terms of all through schools as numbers at Eastbury Community School (secondary phase) are down by 50.
- 7.4 RN questioned the reasoning behind only funding 29 rather than 58 which is the full loss of the bulge class at Valence and asked for this to be reconsidered. It was confirmed that it for SF to decide as to whether the full loss will be included on this occasion. SH suggested that this be taken to the FMG for consideration on previous decisions as this may impact other bulge classes for this academic year.

11. Music Service Funding Contribution by schools

11.1 The CMS have moved into a traded relationship with individual schools. Extensive conversations with schools have taken place. More than 75% of schools have confirmed, with further confirmations anticipated. There is ongoing contact with schools yet to confirm.

- 11.2 75% of schools needed to confirm in order for the SLA model to work. Money previously came from central services. This will not be taken from school budgets, there will be individual SLA with schools who will be invoiced by the CMS directly.

- 14.2 Consistent Financial Return data to be uploaded onto the DfE Collect Database. KA updated colleagues a change in the deadline on the on the Collect Upload database. The deadline was 31 July but is now 15 July 2021, this means that CFR returns will have to be uploaded onto the database by the 2 July 2021. This will give Finance two weeks to review, quality assure and approve uploads before the 15 July. The DfE will be naming and shaming LAs that delay this process.
