Kitchen equipment replacement / refurbishment project

Update for Schools Forum

February 2013

Progress update

Schools Forum agreed in September 2012 to support a short-term project to bring equipment in school kitchens to a good, serviceable standard in readiness for schools to take on this responsibility from April 2013.

At the time the previous report was presented to Forum, a survey of all kitchens was being undertaken to determine which equipment needed to be replaced or, if appropriate, repaired. This survey was completed by the end of September and an itemised report for each school was prepared by the contractor.

However, it soon became evident that the information provided was not as detailed or comprehensive as required for the project. Consequently, a significant number of sites required a revisit to glean the necessary information, adding some delay to the planned timescale.

Following the completion of this initial stage of the project, a procurement exercise was undertaken and a supplier chosen from an ESPO (Eastern Shires Purchasing Organisation) framework contract.

The successful supplier was Airdale Group plc who have now been contracted to supply and install all major items of equipment from our procurement list. They will also remove and dispose of any redundant equipment as well as supplying many of the smaller items (e.g. toasters etc.) that do not require specialist installation.

The procurement phase was successfully completed towards the end of January and installation of equipment is expected to start from the second week of February (by the time Schools Forum considers this report, installation should be well underway). Although the procurement and legal processes took rather longer to complete than expected, the project is still on track to deliver the vast majority of the work before the end of March 2013.

In a few cases where the work may require several days to complete, or where it needs to be coordinated with other works within the school, the installation may be delayed

until the Easter Holiday period. In these cases, the project team will liaise directly with the schools concerned to make the necessary arrangements. These cases are, however, relatively few.

Financial summary

The original estimate for the project was for a total cost of between £800K and £1M.

The final cost has come in at £807.5K, which includes all replacement equipment, installation and project costs, extended warranties and any equipment already purchased by the Catering Service on schools' behalf in the current financial year as well as a small contingency for additional, unexpected, installation costs.

A summary of equipment costs for each site is attached for information.

Once installation is complete, each school will receive an asset report indicating which equipment has been replaced together with its cost, expected lifespan and warranty details. For equipment that has not been replaced, the indicative cost of replacement (based on current prices) and its estimated remaining life (as judged by the contractor) will be shown.

It is expected that all equipment will have an indicative lifespan of at least 5 years from the date of installation.

Copy of letter to schools January 2013

Dear Colleague

Kitchen Equipment Replacement / Refurbishment Programme

As you will be aware, Schools Forum supported the proposal to fund a short-term programme to bring equipment in schools kitchens to a good serviceable standard by the end of the current financial year in readiness for schools to take on-going responsibility from April 2013.

I am very pleased to be able to advise you that despite some initial delays in the procurement and legal phases of the project, a suitable equipment supplier / contractor has been selected and we are now in a position to begin installation of replacement equipment within the next few weeks.

Each school has been audited by a specialist contractor and any equipment that needed immediate replacement or was reaching the end of its serviceable life has been identified. The contractor has also provided an estimate of the likely lifespan of the remaining equipment that is working and fully serviceable to enable future planning.

All school audit reports have been reviewed by the Catering Services Operations Team and school cooks have been asked for their input to ensure that, as far as possible, everything has been taken into account.

Kevin Taggart is managing this project and will be writing to you over the coming weeks with more detailed site-specific information about the provision for your school. Where major pieces of equipment are to be replaced a member of his team will liaise with you to discuss the installation arrangements beforehand in order to minimise disruption. Smaller items will be replaced without interruption to the normal routine of the school kitchen.

Once this work is completed each school will receive an asset list of kitchen equipment with indicative lifespans and replacement costs and also any maintenance / servicing arrangements that have been put in place for the newly replaced equipment. This should assist schools in planning a future replacement programme.

All equipment in school kitchens after the completion of this programme will have an expected lifespan of at least 5 years (based on the contractor's professional estimate of condition at the time of survey or installation) and in some cases considerably longer. Again, this should provide a good basis on which to plan for replacements.
