Dear resident,

In these difficult times people are feeling the pinch. Whether you are renting or buying, travelling to work, or simply putting food on the table, everything has gone up except wages. When we stood on our doorsteps clapping for the nurses during the pandemic, we were determined to do every little bit to make things better. That is why we are making sure you know where help is now.

You'll find lots of information about the support we offer in the following pages – help we are providing along with our partners in the community based where you live. But we know you want us to do more as a council. And that is what we have done over the past few years.

That includes **helping more than 3,000 people find work** through our Job Shops, **supporting more than 10,000 people out of debt**, saving nearly £2m, through the advice on offer in our Homes and Money Hubs. And we have **helped more than 1,000 people save money** on their heating bills through our Cosy Homes scheme.

March is also a month when council tax bills drop onto people's doorsteps, and they rightly want to know where their money is going.

Our biggest priority is looking after the most vulnerable – whether it is the elderly, frail or those not able to cope without support in the community. **For every £10 we spend, £7 goes on caring for the most vulnerable people**. We will always respond to people in need. But while demand for our services has risen, funding we receive from the government has not. Nonetheless, we have managed to protect frontline services by being more determined and efficient, and by attracting inward investment. Over the last decade **we've secured more than £4bn worth of investment**. That means for every £1 we are asking each household to pay for services, we have managed to secure around £500. This includes thousands of jobs, homes, and opportunities for people to gain new skills in the borough.

Once known for Ford cars, it will not be long before we will be known for film as work is completed on **two new film studios**. And speaking of our industrial past – we've put it to good use. We desperately need more housing. **Beam Park and Dagenham Green** are seeing new homes, parks and schools being built.

Today we are the biggest council housing builder in London – constructing **one in five of all affordable homes in the capital**. You once had to be born in Victorian times to see a new train station open. Unless you live in **Barking Riverside** where the new station opened ahead of schedule (unlike the trains) last year. Offering new schools, shops, leisure facilities, and riverside walks, it is London's newest neighbourhood. It even offers a **boat service** into the city and south of the river so you can leave your car keys at home.

We're already home to the UK's largest data centre, and a research facility that is designing the cities of the future. The World-famous markets of London - Billingsgate, Smithfield, and New Spitalfields -



are also relocating here. That's meat and three veg plus your favourite fish supper on a Friday night on our doorstep.

We have always celebrated our parks. But we have **planted more than 60,000 trees** and invested millions of pounds in improving them, in the last few years.

We all lead busy lives, but we also want to do our bit for the environment. Thanks to the investment in the way we collect your waste, we're now throwing less into landfill and recycling more – in fact, 250kg in every home – equivalent to a Ford Fiesta every four years! That's important for future generations. And it's a never-ending task with the cold winters and hot summers we get these days, but we have invested £21.7m in repairing roads and pavements. 189 miles of them – equivalent to the distance from here to Grimsby!

We have not sat on our laurels. We **fought plans to close Dagenham police station** and we saved it. We are fighting for a better police presence in Barking Town Centre and we will have **police reporting points** in some of the Community Hubs as we open them.

We were also the first council in the country to adopt a borough-wide private **landlord licensing scheme** that upholds standards for those renting, offering protection from rogue landlords, and we were the first to secure a ban on **illegal encampments** which cause havoc.

Our **free Summer of Festivals events** have been attended by 421,000 residents in the last few years. And we're proud of the part we played in our nation's history, as together, we celebrated the late **Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee** and honoured her life with our very own Proclamation and Memorial Service.



Our young people are our future. That is why I am proud that **95 per cent of our schools are rated Good or Outstanding** by Ofsted, and that **8 out of 10 young people now continue into higher education**.

We need to provide more things to do and places to go. That's why we opened **Future, London's first Youth Zone**, which has welcomed over 150,000 young people through its doors since it opened.

Community is our middle name. You could say we are proud of it. That's why we celebrated the **100th anniversary of the Becontree Estate** in 2021, and why we are opening a **museum** dedicated to the history, stories, and role of women in society. It's also why we fly the flag on important days in the calendar, like St George's Day, Black History Month and LGBT+ History Month.

Our new **£15m Community Diagnostics Centre** at Barking Community Hospital will make it easier to get a blood test as well as your CT, MRI, or ultrasound.

These are tough times, but we are in this together. I hope you find the information in the following pages helpful. I also hope you will feel proud of some of the things we have achieved together.

Help and support available from the council and our partners

HELP WITH THE COST OF LIVING

Hardship schemes

These funds provide support to vulnerable households in most need of short-term help with significantly rising living and energy costs.

In exceptional circumstances, you may be able to get help with housing costs where Housing Benefit, Universal Credit Housing element or DHP (Discretionary Housing Payments) awards are not eligible or applicable.

To apply for these schemes or support you must:

- be over 18 and a resident of Barking and Dagenham (or supported by the borough)
- be suffering financial hardship
- have had a significant change in your circumstances or life changing event that has placed you into hardship
- have taken all reasonable steps to maximise incomes available to you by claiming Council Tax Support and/or Housing Benefit/ Universal Credit Housing Element, Discretionary Housing Payment, Discretionary Council Tax Relief and/or Universal Credit
- have recourse to public funds.

You don't have to be receiving benefits such as Universal Credit or Housing Benefit to apply.

BD Money

Barking and Dagenham Money (**bdmoney.co.uk**) offers free and impartial financial guidance, and can help you check your eligibility for benefits, and find grants that could be available and money support tools. Have a look at the benefits calculator, the budgeting tool, and the 60 second debt test. There's a range of support available, including information on homes and bills, family and care and dealing with debt.

BD Money is now also offering access to affordable loans and savings through its partnership with Leeds Credit Union – aiming to prevent people from taking out very expensive loans or using illegal loan sharks. It aims to keep more money in your pocket and help build your financial security.

Affordable Loans

We know it's difficult to make ends meet when unexpected costs crop up. But loans with high-interest rates can create bigger problems in the long term.



That's why we've partnered with Leeds Credit Union to offer affordable loan products to anyone who lives or works in Barking and Dagenham. This means you can access a range of loans at a lower interest rate, to help bring your finances under control.

Whether you need a Family Loan to help repair a broken washing machine, or a Consolidation Loan to combine several debts into one low-interest payment, there are options for you. Visit **bdmoney.co.uk** for more information.

Universal Credit

Council Tax Support

From 1 April 2023, this could reduce your Council Tax bill by up to 85% if you are of working age, depending on your income, savings, household and circumstances. If you are of pension age your Council Tax bill could be reduced by up to 100%.

Energy Bill Support (EBSS) - Alternative Funding

The EBSS provides a discount on energy bills of £400 for most households in Great Britain. This scheme is being delivered through domestic electricity suppliers in six instalments, or through prepayment meter vouchers from October 2022 to March 2023.

The EBSS Alternative Funding Scheme is designed to help households that pay for their electricity in a different way i.e. through a service charge and therefore did not receive the original support as they have no domestic supply. It offers a one off £400 non-repayable discount to help eligible households with energy bills. It is open to applications from 27 February 2023 for households who have not already received support with their energy bills.

You cannot apply if you've already had Energy Bill Support Scheme payments.

You do not need to apply if you or your landlord has a domestic energy meter or you pay your bills directly to an energy supplier (such as British Gas or EDF).

HELP WITH ESSENTIALS

Library of Things

Library of Things is open in Barking Learning Centre Community Hub, giving you the chance to borrow useful items like drills, sound systems and sewing machines. It offers over 30 useful household, DIY and gardening items you can borrow from as little as £1.50 per day.

You can reserve items online, ready to collect from a self-service kiosk in Barking Learning Centre Community Hub. People on low incomes will be able to sign up for a Concession Membership which offers 25 per cent off borrowing costs.

Community Food Clubs

If you're on a low income or having money problems, our Community Food Clubs can offer you £20 worth of weekly shopping for free. Find out where they are and if you're eligible to become a member at **lbbd.gov.uk/community-food-clubs**

Holiday Activity and Food (HAF) programme

This programme is free to children and young people who live or go to school in Barking and Dagenham and are eligible for benefit-related free school meals, with paid places available for everyone. Visit **lbbd.gov.uk/free-holiday-activities** or email **hafprogramme@lbbd.gov.uk**



Food banks

There are a number of food banks in Barking and Dagenham that can provide emergency food parcels if you're temporarily unable to provide for yourself. To use some of them, you need to get a voucher to receive a food parcel, so check with them before you visit.

Free school meals

All children in reception, year 1 and year 2 in state funded schools in England are eligible for free school meals. If your child is aged 11 to 16, they are also eligible if you are receiving certain benefits. You can find out more at **lbbd.gov.uk/benefitsand-support/free-school-meals-pupil-premium**

Free mobile data, calls and messages

This scheme can help if you are on a low income and have limited or no access to the internet on your phone or home broadband.

Known as the National Databank, this scheme can help you get online and receive digital skills training. If you're eligible, you can receive one of the following:

- 15GB per month of O2 data and free calls and texts for up to six months
- 20GB per month of Vodafone data and free calls and texts, for up to six months
- 24GB per month of Three data, for up to six months. Calls and texts are not included.

You need a compatible mobile or an unlocked mobile to use the data.

To be eligible, you must be:

- over the age of 18
- from a low-income household
- have limited or no access to the internet at home or when away from home
- unable to afford your existing monthly contract or top-up.
