
To respond Young People's voice about the content of Preparing for Adulthood, we've added the following information on the Young People ages 16-25 subpages:

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Action: with Speak Up Young People Forum

- Usability testing started at Speak Up Young People Forum (Speak Up) on 19th October. Speak Up were invited to provide feedback about the functionality, navigation, accessibility, layout and design
- The website's logo, the Young People Subpage's name and icon are only temporary. Speak Up is currently designing them and will confirm the designs very soon.
