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Top Tips for parents and carers

High Aspirations and Expectations for children with SEN:

✓ All schools and colleges have a duty to use their best endeavours and make reasonable adjustments to provide support to children and young people with SEN.

SEN Support:

- Schools and colleges should use SEN support, a graduated approach (Assess Plan Do Review cycle) to support pupils with SEN and disabilities.
- Inclusion and Exclusion:
- Through early intervention and looking at key strategies such as the prevention of/and reducing exclusion, schools should focus on ways to engage children and young people in their learning and keep pupils in schools to achieve good attendance. Exclusion should be a last resort. For guidance, please visit or contact Inclusion Team: inclusion@lbbd.gov.uk
- ✓ If your child has an EHCP with a threat of an exclusion, school should arrange an emergency review of an EHCP, or request an increase SEN support, or seek specialist advice from services. If you have this concern, please contact your allocated <u>EHC Co-ordinator</u>.

Health Services for CYP with SEND



There is an up to date list of health services for children and young people with SEND on our <u>Local Offer</u> Website. Here are some links of the health provision:

- <u>Audiology</u>: consultant-led service provides assessment and management of hearing and balance in people aged up to 19.
- <u>Barking and Dagenham CAMHS</u>: provide child and adolescent mental health & emotional wellbeing services.
- <u>Child and Adolescent Speech and Language Therapy</u>: provides specialist diagnosis and treatment of communication and/or feeding and swallowing difficulties for children and young people up to the age of 16 years.
- <u>Children's Integrated Therapies SALT, OT & PT</u>: The team works with children and young people (CYP) aged 0-19. They have 6 pathways with clear entry criteria and set packages of care based on need.
- <u>Paediatric Occupational Therapy and Physiotherapy</u>: they assess the child, set goals with the child and family and/or school to help them achieve their physical potential.
