Foreword from the Leader of the Council

Dear resident,

Just like families living in the borough, councils up and down the country face unprecedented pressures on their budgets.

We have all grown used to bigger bills and a hike in shopping prices. One of the consequences has been more people who need our support. That's why we have worked hard alongside our community partners to help residents as part of our Cost Of Living Alliance. You can find more information at one of our Community Hubs or on pages 4-5.

At the same time, the last few years have been marked by austerity or dwindling funding for public services. As a council, today we receive just 40% of what we received a decade ago - for every £1 we had then we have just 66p today. And just 16% of our funding comes from local council tax from residents. That means we are largely reliant on funding from central government. And it's why we are trying to make every penny count.

However, just as our funding has fallen so dramatically, our population has grown! 33,000 more people call the borough home today compared to 10 years ago and one in four residents are not old enough yet to have sat their GCSEs. All this has increased demand for our services.

We all want to be looked after in old age or if we have a fall or something happens to us. But the rising cost of social care for our elderly and vulnerable people is also something that has added pressure on our budget.

Despite this, we continue to be a borough of huge ambition. In the last few years, we have secured £4 billion of investment with nearly 10,000 new homes, our two film studios (the second one opens later this year) and the three wholesale markets of London, on top of world-class scientific facilities at London East in Dagenham. And we have left no stone unturned in working to secure more jobs through the Thames Freeport.

As the borough that helped secure equal pay for women, I am hugely proud to see a women's museum opening in Barking this month. It will celebrate all that we have in common as well as the vital contribution women have made to our lives.




















We're securing new jobs, homes





Despite the challenges we face, we're doing everything we can to unlock our borough's potential. We're securing investment and creating new partnerships to deliver the homes, jobs and opportunities our community needs.

Jobs and local investment

We've secured billions of pounds in investment, and brought in thousands of jobs, homes and new opportunities over the past ten years.

And we're committed to making sure that all residents get the chance to benefit with training, workshops, skills classes and much more.

Leading the way is Film Barking and Dagenham's 'Make it Here' programme. It has seen thousands of local students having the opportunity to use film equipment at industry led careers days. access vocational training and learn more about opportunities in the film sector. It's part of our drive to bring the big screen to Barking and Dagenham with East London's newest film studios. They'll bring a multi-million-pound boost to the local economy, creating jobs for local people and opportunities for local businesses.

And our new relationship with the Corporation of London is bringing London's iconic meat, vegetable and fish markets right here.

We're also working with international partners. Last year we signed a groundbreaking agreement with South Korea's Seoul Digital Foundation, the Thames Freeport and Connected Places Catapult to launch a Smart Homes Innovation Hub in Barking.

It will improve the energy and heating efficiency of existing homes in the borough - lowering bills for residents and reducing carbon emissions.

The project will also make homes safer, especially for more vulnerable residents, through the development of health tech that can be used in the home and in the community.

Building homes our residents need

We're proud to be one of the largest affordable home builders in the country, we're currently building one in five of all affordable homes in London, and we're not stopping.

We have one of the largest house building programmes in the country at Barking Riverside and over 1,500 new homes are under construction through Be First right across Barking and Dagenham.

Building safe, warm, high-quality homes is a key priority for us and we aim to build over 40,000 homes by 2037 as well as creating 20,000 new jobs.



A safer and greener borough for you

Park life

Our parks are the living, breathing heart of Barking and Dagenham. Since 2017, we've secured over £23 million of investment to transform and improve our much-loved green spaces.

We have six Green Flag Awards under our belt, which recognise the best managed parks and green spaces, and we're working hard to secure even more over the coming years.

Parsloes Park, one of the largest open green spaces in Dagenham, is home to the brand-new £12.8m Bobby Moore Sports Hub, providing a fantastic upgrade of football facilities for the community. The hub boasts three 3G pitches, gym facilities, a café, plus a social space for the community to enjoy every single day.

We've also invested over £1 million in delivering a major park development scheme at Central Park. The improvements include landscaping, tree and wild flower planting, and a brand-new toddler playground. A junior adventure play area and a number of improvements to footpaths and accessibility are still to come.

Women's safety
