- 2. Participation of young people and their families.
- 3. Access to speech & language support.
- 4. Training & support for parents.
- 5. Pathways to Adulthood & Transitions.
- 6. Increasing specialist places.

Denise Watts – Head of Statutory SEND Services

- **EHC Assessments:** improvement in performance (20 weeks) from 9% at end of 2023, to 67% in January 2024.
- **EHCP Multi Agency Audits:** multi agency audits started in December 2023, look at the quality of EHC statutory advice and EHCPs issued following assessment and review. Will continue on 4-6 weekly cycle.
- **Annual Reviews:** revision of associated guidance for settings and parent carers, with particular focus on Preparation for Adulthood (Year 8+).
- **Service Recruitment:** SEND Careers Advisors (February 2024) Preparation for Adulthood Lead (March 2024).
- Family Hubs SEND Drop In Sessions: SEND Co-Production Lead (Gigi Kwong) working with Early Help colleagues: Dagenham Library (4 March 2024) and Marks Gate Community (15 April 2024)

3. Dynamic Support Register (DSR) and Key Working

Dynamic Support Registers



- The Dynamic Support Register (DSR) is a register of children and adults with a learning disability and/or autism who are at risk of mental health hospital admissions.
- There are separate DSRs and holders for Children and adults. They are held at the borough level by a named lead (either ICB, Health, Social care).
- The purpose of the DSR is to prevent inappropriate hospital <u>admission</u>, <u>or</u> reduce length of stay where admission is due to a lack of the right care and treatment in the community.
- The DSRs are reviewed regularly by <u>a MDT group</u> (DSR holders, partners in health, social care, education and SEND) to ensure that there is oversight and accountability for those at risk of hospital admission.
- Anyone can refer to the DSR, including self-referrals. <u>However</u> they cannot be accepted onto the DSR without documented consent.

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Erik Stein – Head of Participation Opportunity & Wellbeing

- Strengthened partnership working with Barking and Dagenham College, particularly around improving progression into employment.
- Speak Up! Forum commissioned for young people with SEND, with plan of consultation themes for the year (including issues raised by young people).
- Speak Up! consultation report for libraries was welcomed by libraries and is leading to changes.
- Accelerating Post-16 SEND outcomes action plan in place

12 actions achievable within six months across 5 areas:

- Improving the Annual Review process;
- Widening support for parents/ carers;
- Improving Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance;
- Improving access to supported internships and employment;
- Broadening post-16 options.

Specialist Places

- Riverside Bridge September 2024 additional 30 places plus 6th form places.
- Trinity School Council has committed investment for refurbishment and new area to support parents.
- Oxlow Bridge new 100 place Special School to include PMLD provision with hydrotherapy pool due to open September 2025.

Some key features of the new school include:

- 16 large general classrooms, each with direct access to an outside covered teaching area, as well as access to additional outdoor areas for play, learning and sensory exploration.
- Ceiling mounted tracked hoists will provide connection between classrooms and adjacent Hygiene Rooms.
- A Hydrotherapy Pool, Life Skills, Art / Music and Sensory & Therapy rooms which will all benefit from having a ceiling mounted tracked hoist.
- A mixture of specialist Sensory and Therapy rooms centrally located for ease of use by all.
- A multi-use Hall which will have a trampoline built into the floor to assist pupils with therapy.
- Large rooflights to provide natural light to corridors and open areas of shared storage areas will help to make circulation spaces feel more comfortable.
