Why worry about damp and mould?

Mould produces allergens and irritants, and releases spores which cause respiratory problems. This can lead to serious infections, breathing difficulties, allergic reactions such as sneezing, skin rashes, and lead to asthma attacks.

How to reduce damp and mould?

Report – Report damp and mould concerns to your landlord as soon as possible to make sure action is taken.

Insulate – Speak to your landlord about loft and wall insulation, and draught proofing if your home needs improvements.

Heat correctly - On cold days, keep the temperature in bedrooms between 18 to 21° C. In living rooms, lower the heat at night and when you leave your property. If heaters don't work, or if there is no thermostat or controls, you must report this to your landlord.

Ventilate - Extractor fans are a low-cost way to ventilate and make a big difference. Dehumidifiers reduce humidity and condensation which will save you money in the long run as you will be heating your home less.

Reduce moisture - Cook with lids on pots to prevent steam from escaping. Keep your bathroom door closed during and after showers and baths until the moisture laden air has left via the extractor fan or the window. Wipe away condensation on windows.

Dry clothes outside - During colder months, you can dry clothes outside or in bathrooms with the door closed. Opening the window slightly or having an extractor fan on will help clothes to dry quicker.

Cleaning - You can use a damp cloth, taking care to dry the wall afterwards. Use warm water with a detergent or use approved mouldicide or fungicidal washes to wipe away mould growth.
