TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER

**THE LONDON BOROUGH OF BARKING AND DAGENHAM
(PEDESTRIAN AND CYCLE ZONES) (VARIOUS ROADS)
ORDER 2025**

The Council of the London Borough of Barking and Dagenham in exercise of their powers under Sections 6 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter called "the Act") as amended by the relevant provisions of the Local Government Act 1985 the Parking Act 1989 and all other enabling and amending legislation and enabling powers, and after consultation with the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis in accordance with Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Act, hereby make the following Order:

1. This Order shall come into operation on 29th May 2025 and may be cited as The London Borough of Barking and Dagenham (Pedestrian and Cycle Zones) (Various Roads) Order 2025.
2. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply to this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. For the purposes of this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:
 - a. "enactment" means any enactment whether public, general or local and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment and any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment;
 - b. "council" means the Council of the London Borough of Barking and Dagenham;
 - c. "motor vehicle" has the same meaning as that in Section 136 of the Act;
 - d. "pedal cycle" has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016;
 - e. "prescribed hours" means the periods specified in column 2 of Schedule 1 to this Order in relation to the streets or sections of streets specified in column 1 of that Schedule;
 - f. "provision of a universal postal service" and "universal service provider" have the same meanings as in Part 3 of the Postal Services Act 2011;
 - g. "school street permit" means a permit issued by the Council at their discretion, to allow motorists to enter the streets or sections of streets specified in column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Order during the prescribed hours;
 - h. "permit holder" means a person to whom a school street permit has been issued under the provisions of this Order;

- i. "traffic sign" has the same meaning as in section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984; and
4. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order no person shall cause any motor vehicle to enter the Pedestrian and Cycle Zones in the streets or sections of streets shown in Schedule 1 to this Order during the prescribed hours.
5. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall apply to:-
 - a. A pedal cycle;
 - b. a security vehicle or a vehicle bearing a livery which is used by a universal service provider and which is stopped at the edge of the carriageway for as long as may be necessary for the purposes of the provision of a universal postal service;
 - c. a vehicle being used for the laying, erection, alteration or repairs of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication system provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the performance of such duties for that vehicle to enter any section of street specified in those articles;
 - d. any vehicle when used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for that vehicle to enter any section of street specified in those articles.
6. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall apply to a valid Permit Holder.
7. Nothing in this Order shall apply:-
 - a. To a vehicle being used for Fire brigade, Police or Ambulance purposes;
 - b. To anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; or
 - c. To any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs places pursuant to Sections 66 or 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984.

b) Ford Road (access road to William Ford C of E Junior School) both sides, from its junction with Ford Road southwards for distance of 38 metres.	8.00am to 9.15am 2.45pm to 4.00pm Mon to Fri
