Young people and residents benefiting from **26** work experience placement, **25** voluntary roles, **210** careers or employability activities.

50 Volunteering days providing Schools maintenance & repairs, careers event support and tree planting.

Maximising impact

- Work to support outcomes on local employment outcomes including for residents with learning disabilities/Autism

for the community as a whole."




USING OUR PLANNING & BUYING POWERS

- The Council used planning powers (Section 106) to generated at least 346 jobs for local people on major local developments including 12 apprenticeships.
- The Council spent £153m with local companies out of a total £394m contracted and non-contracted spend (39% against a target of 25%)



- **FOOD**
- Secured resources to improve access to good food in LBBD.
- Engaged 1,001 people through growing and cooking clubs delivered through community partners.
- Engaged **2,292** local students in food-related events and activities.



FILM

- Secured benefits linked to new film studios in LBBD.
- Trained 32 adults to work in the film sector.
- Supported **29** local people into paid roles on visiting productions.
- Engaged 759 students on a Film
 Enterprise competition in local schools.
