THE LONDON BOROUGH OF BARKING AND DAGENHAM (20MPH ZONE SPEED LIMIT) (HEATH ROAD AND SURROUNDING AREA, DAGENHAM) ORDER 2026 THE LONDON BOROUGH OF BARKING AND DAGENHAM (7.5T WEIGHT RESTRICTION) (HEATH ROAD AND SURROUNDING AREA, DAGNEHAM) ORDER 2026

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Barking and Dagenham in exercise of its powers under sections 6, 84 and 124 and Parts I to IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended (hereinafter called "the Act") and all other enabling legislation and powers and after consultation with the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis in accordance with Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Act made the above Order, the effect of which will be to:

1. Introduce a 20mph Zone Speed Limit and prohibit all Goods Vehicles, the maximum gross weight of which exceeds 7.5 tonnes, except for loading at the following locations:
 - a. Back Lane, for its entire extent.
 - b. Bennett Road, for its entire extent.
 - c. Broomfield Road, for its entire extent.
 - d. Burlington Gardens, for its entire extent.
 - e. Cecil Road, for its entire extent.
 - f. Eric Road, for its entire extent.
 - g. Eustace Road, for its entire extent.
 - h. Farrance Road, for its entire extent.
 - i. Heath Road, for its entire extent.
 - j. Junction Road East, for its entire extent.
 - k. Junction Road West, for its entire extent.
 - l. Kenneth Road, for its entire extent.
 - m. Merten Road, for its entire extent.
 - n. Morden Road, for its entire extent.
 - o. Plantagenet Gardens, for its entire extent.
 - p. Plantagenet Place, for its entire extent.
 - q. St Chads Gardens, for its entire extent.
 - r. St Chads Road, for its entire extent.
 - s. Wadeville Avenue, for its entire extent.
 - t. Woodlands Avenue, for its entire extent.

A copy of the Orders, which will come into force on 8 June 2026 and the Council's Statement of Reasons for making the Orders are available to view for a period of 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders were made on the Council's website by visiting the following webpage <https://www.lbbd.gov.uk/parking/parking-area> and selecting 'New and proposed traffic and parking schemes' or available for inspection at the Adult Library, First Floor, Barking Learning Centre, Barking between the hours of 9.00am and 4.00pm Monday to Friday.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that they are not within the powers of the Act, or that any requirement of the Act or any Regulations under it have not been complied with may do so within six weeks of the made date of the Order by applying to the High Court.
