## **THE LONDON BOROUGH OF BARKING AND DAGENHAM (WAITING AND PARKING RESTRICTIONS) (BOUNDARY ROAD, BARKING) AMENDMENT No. 165 ORDER 2026** **THE LONDON BOROUGH OF BARKING AND DAGENHAM (ONE-WAY RESTRICTIONS) (BOUNDARY ROAD, BARKING) ORDER 2026**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Barking and Dagenham in exercise of its powers under sections 6 and 124 and Parts I to IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended (hereinafter called "the Act") and all other enabling legislation and powers and after consultation with the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis in accordance with Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Act made the above Orders, the effect of which will be to:

1. Introduce 'No Waiting at any time' restrictions at the following locations:
  - a. Boundary Road, north-west side, from its junction with Abbey Road for 45.5 metres in a north-easterly direction.
  - b. Boundary Road, south-east side, from its junction with Abbey Road for 10.6 metres in a north-easterly direction.
  - c. Boundary Road, south-east side, from a point 25.1 metres north-east its junction with Abbey Road for 4.6 metres in a north-easterly direction.
2. Introduce 'Disabled Blue Badge Holder' bays at the following locations:
  - a. Boundary Road, south-east side, from a point 10.6 metres north-east of its junction with Abbey Road for 14.5 metres in a north-easterly direction.
  - b. Boundary Road, south-east side, from a point 29.7 metres north-east of its junction with Abbey Road for 14.5 metres in a north-easterly direction.
3. Introduce a 'One-way' restriction on Boundary Road, from its junction with Abbey Road for 46 metres in a north-easterly direction.

A copy of the Orders, which will come into force on 6 July 2026 and the Council's Statement of Reasons for making the Orders are available to view for a period of 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders were made on the Council's website by visiting the following webpage <https://www.lbbd.gov.uk/parking/parking-area> and selecting 'New and proposed traffic and parking schemes' or available for inspection at the Adult Library, First Floor, Barking Learning Centre, Barking between the hours of 9.00am and 4.00pm Monday to Friday.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that they are not within the powers of the Act, or that any requirement of the Act or any Regulations under it have not been complied with may do so within six weeks of the made date of the Order by applying to the High Court.
