HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 SECTION 90A-F ROAD HUMPS AND THE HIGHWAYS (ROAD HUMPS) REGULATIONS 1999 INTRODUCE SPEED CUSHIONS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT the Council of the London Borough of Barking and Dagenham intends to introduce the following traffic calming measures;

1. 2x3 metre speed cushions centered in the carriageway and consisting of a 1:8 gradient on top and 1:4 gradient to the sides on Haskard Road, at the following locations:
 - a. Outside the common boundary of Property Nos. 63 and 65 Haskard Road.
 - b. Outside Property No. 48 Haskard Road.
 - c. Outside the common boundary of Property Nos. 19 and 21 Haskard Road.
 - d. Adjacent to Property No. 315 Porters Avenue.
2. 2x3 metre speed cushions centered in the carriageway and consisting of a 1:8 gradient on top and 1:4 gradient to the sides on Wren Road, at the following locations:
 - a. Outside Property No. 145 Wren Road.
 - b. Outside Property No. 119 Wren Road.
 - c. Outside Property No. 62 Wren Road.
 - d. Outside the common boundary of Property Nos. 69 and 71 Wren Road.
 - e. Outside the common boundary of Property Nos. 24 and 26 Wren Road.
 - f. Outside Property No. 4 Wren Road
