

THE LONDON BOROUGH OF BARKING AND DAGENHAM (PARKING AND WAITING RESTRICTIONS) (AMENDMENT No. 53) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2020

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Barking and Dagenham in exercise of its powers under Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended (hereinafter called “the Act”) as amended by the relevant provisions of the Local Government Act 1985 the Parking Act 1989 and of all other enabling legislation and powers and after consultation with the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis in accordance with Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Act made the above Order, the effect of which will be to introduce changes to the London Borough of Barking and Dagenham (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) Consolidation Order 2016, “the 2016 Order” as follows:

1. To Introduce No Waiting At Any Time restrictions, on the Access Road to Mill Point, at the following locations;
 - i. North side, from its junction with Abbey Road for a distance 16.5 metres in a westerly direction.
 - ii. South Side, from its junction with Abbey Road for a distance 50 metres in a westerly direction.
2. To Introduce Unrestricted Parking Bays, on the Access Road to Mill Point, at the following locations;
 - i. North side, from a point 16.5 metres west of its junction with Abbey Road for a distance of 28.5 metres in a westerly direction.
 - ii. South side, from a point 15 metres west of its junction with Abbey Road for a distance of 13 metres in a westerly direction.
 - iii. South side, from a point 31 metres west of its junction with Abbey Road for a distance of 9.5 metres in a westerly direction.

The Council will be considering in due course whether the provisions of the Order should be continued in force indefinitely by means of a permanent Order made under sections 6 and 124 of the Act, as amended. Any person may object to the making of the permanent Order for the purpose of such indefinite continuation within a period of six months beginning with the day on which the above-mentioned Order came into operation or, if the Order is varied by other Orders, beginning with the day on which the latest variation or modification came into operation. Any such objection must be made in writing and must state the grounds on which it is made and be sent for the attention of Sarah Marriott-Carle to the address below or to www.lbbd.gov.uk/tmofeedback, quoting ref ID362 – Mill Point. Any objection may be communicated to other persons who may be affected.
